MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

If there's one single thing that I detest about being president of Special Forces Chapter XV, it is coordinating and participating in funerals of chapter members and spouses. Some deaths, I must admit, affect me more adversely than others and that was the case of the passing of my long time amigo and Special Forces brother, Dallas Longstreath III. His history as a quiet and heroic green beret warrior is well documented in numerous after-action official reports but I believe it is most vividly indelible in the hearts and minds of his Special Forces brothers that fought alongside him in many combat operations in Vietnam.

As told by several Special Operations soldiers, Dallas was instrumental in saving many lives. He will long be remembered and talked about in venues such as national conventions, but mostly in the Hospitality Rooms of the Special Operations Reunions! Dallas, being an extremely private person, except while enjoying a cold Bud lite, and in the company of his special and close friends, never expounded on his heroic exploits in combat. In fact if he did, he had a humorous way of recalling his stories. That's truly a mark of and a definition of a warrior! He never "blew his own horn".

I first met Dallas in Kontum in 1968 when he was assigned to the then, secret and clandestine organization, Studies and Observation Group based at Forward Observation Base II and I was doing some interesting work with the Phoenix/Provincial Reconnaissance Unit. I lost track of him until I retired in 1983 when I became active in chapter XV. Since that time, we continued to be close friends. I bid you farewell amigo. You ran the race, kept the faith and never faltered in combat. We will meet again. Of that I am certain! You did your duty and served our country well. "You were a good guy, you! My brother wrote a poem about our older brother upon his death. Both were WWII Veterans. I sincerely believe that it applies to Dallas so it is reprinted here on the following page.
