
MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Treasurer's Report, December 2017

Financially, 2017 was a good year for SFA Chapter XV. The Chapter officers tip our berets to those who contributed time and money, enabling us to support our community and promote harmony within our ranks. All projects and events were within the approved budget.

During the year, Chapter XV donated \$7,600 to charity and community support projects. The Alamo Chapter made cash donations to VFW Post 8541, Veterans of Greater San Antonio, DAV of San Antonio, Women and Children's Shelter, Boys & Girls Club, Blue Knights Motorcycle Club's Back to School Program, Save the Montagnard Project (STMP,) O.A.S.I.S., Lake Texhoma fishing and golf outing for Gulf War Veterans, and SFA Chapter IX Golf Tournament hole. Also, six \$500 scholarship grants were awarded to children and grandchildren of Chapter members, and we presented JROTC High School Awards (medals and framed certificates) to more than 30 area students.

Our prime sources of revenue for 2017 were the annual Dick's Last Resort fundraiser and a drawing for an AR-15 and Glock donated by Buddy Gee and Bill Smith. Revenue sources also included membership renewals; generous member donations; door prize drawings at each meeting, newsletter advertising and merchandise sales.

Events supported with Chapter funds were all within the approved annual budget: the Christmas Banquet, the Canyon Lake Picnic, the Chapter XV Memorial Service and the Cotulla Hog Cookoff. The Chapter bank accounts are in good shape and the checking account roll-over balance will enable us to continue our support of good causes.

New VA ID Applications System Still Down


The system for new veteran ID cards was still down as of December 19, 2017. The system went down less than a week after Veterans Affairs' official rollout of new identification cards, and there are few details on when the system will be working again.

VA spokesman Curt Cashour said in a statement that department officials are aware that "some veterans have experienced issues with the application process, but leaders of VA's Office of Information and Technology are actively engaged in fixing them."

The new cards won't replace VA medical cards or official defense retiree cards, and will not carry any force of law behind them. Once the system is operational again, veterans will need to register for an online account with VA to apply for the card.
