Electronic voting for National Board Officer candidates will be available through Club Express from May 1-31, 2022 on the national website.

The results of the special ballot to amend SFA Constitution Article IV, Section III, Paragraph B. "Voting rights to exclude Associate members from voting in any national-level elections" are as follows:

Yes - 62.4% REMOVE the voting right of Associate members in national-level elections and special ballots.

No - 37.6% CONTINUE to allow Associate Members to vote in all ballots and elections

Effective immediately, only SFA Decade members (D-xxxxx) and SFA General members (M-xxxxx) will be authorized to vote in any SFA National level elections, ie. SFA NBO elections and SFA Constitutional Amendments.



Note:

1. This DOES NOT impact the ability for Associate members to vote at the Chapter level, only National level balloting.
2. SFA National will continue to solicit the opinions of all members when considering programs/ventures that affect all SFA members. One current program being considered is the Partnership with AUSA.

Our next meeting will be Saturday, June 11th. Our board meeting will start at 11:30am. Lunch will begin at noon; remember we are now buying our lunch from the kitchen. Plates are \$10-\$12 dollars depending on the entrée being served. Our membership meeting will start at 1pm. Hope to see you there and stay safe!

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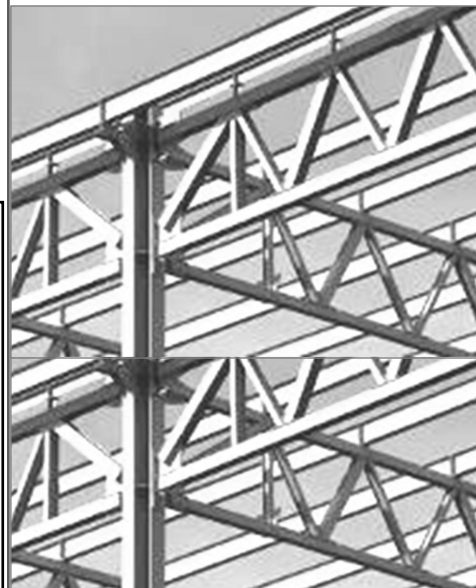


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SFA A-663 (Life)
