<u>\$\$\$ DOLLARS AND CENTS</u> <u>Report from the Treasurer</u>

Thanks to generous donations from our members, the Chapter had income of \$975 during February. However, we laid out \$2,582 in expenses during the month – including \$1,875 in charitable contributions. \$525 of February income was earmarked for meals for the monthly meetings. We thank the donors who paid this month: Pat Connolly, J.W. Martin, Bill Smith, and Simeon Trombitas. Also a tip of our berets to members who donated a combined \$120 to the General and Scholarship Funds: John Rodden, J.R. Garza, Larrry Dollarhide, and Steve Schoenicke. Sgt.-at-Arms Raul de la Garza collected \$150 from the door prize drawing and merchandise sales, and we had \$65 net income from member dues. Expenses included checks issued to the following nonprofit organizations, in accordance with the Chapter's 2016 budget: VFW Post 8541, Save the Montagnard People, Retired Border Patrol Association, and Veterans of Greater San Antonio.

At the February meeting, the membership voted to donate \$500 from the SF Emergency Relief Fund to the widow of a deceased member, and \$150 was donated for food at the funeral service of Chapter member Lewis W. Like. The month's expenses also covered new tires for the War Wagon, renewal of the Internet domain and payment for the meeting meal.

J'II hang up my green beret and sip no more the wine of pride,


