



## SF License Plate considered

**G** . M. "Zak" Kozak, president of Chapter 41 in Austin, has provided an update on the campaign to establish a Special Forces license plate in Texas.



He has requested his state senator and state representative to sponsor a bill in the next legislative session, which convenes Jan. 12, 2021. While Sen. Charles Schwertner did not definitely commit to carry the bill, his staff said they "just need a little more time to find out if the senator is expected to carry any large pieces of legislation and how much of a time commitment that would be."

Asked whether SFA members could reasonably expect the proposal to enable us to obtain Army Special Forces plates in 2021, the reply was: "These bills typically don't receive any real opposition, so yes, we believe so."

These would not be "vanity plates" and would involve no additional fees. Drivers who are SF qualified would simply present proof of their qualification to the county tax office when applying. Kozak has asked other chapters to contact their representatives to encourage their support. traditions will you start? Maybe instead of making such decisions in January when we are less inclined to go out and make changes, we should be saying: New June – New Me – New You.


Now, especially as we are feeling the recent virus-inspired restrictions loosen, it is time to have a season of firsts to put us

## **RECUERDO (REMEMBRANCE)**


