As you all should know by now, chapter member Margaret Tippy passed away



TAPS: Eugene "Gene" Gutierrez 9/14/1921 – 8/25/2022

Chapter XV was well represented at the funeral in McAllen of Eugene Gutierrez, a longtime Chapter member who died Aug. 25, just weeks before his 101st birthday. He had fought in Europe with the First Special Service Force (Devil's Brigade) during WWII.

Burial was Sept. 8 at the Rio Grande Valley State Veteran's Cemetery in Mission, TX, with full military honors conducted by the 10th Special Forces Group. Attending from Chapter XV were President John Lopez, Buddy Gee, Merrill Hall and Juan Montoya. Also in attendance were Former 5th Group commander COL (Ret.) - Veteran Affairs advocacy to review current military/personnel service medical records or post-service VA.
- Pre-transition briefings for Special Forces soldiers and their family.
- Assess previous service documentation or records for a condition or an injury that could have potentially led to a service-connection: the in-service injury or diagnosis.
- Access to our regional Accredited Veterans Services Officers (VSO) to file an original or updated VA disability claim.
- Locating any treatment records or archived documents as evidence to submit when filing VA disability claims.

Chaplain's Corner

Reaching Out and Lifting Up

am writing this on the 5th of October – more than a few days after it was asked for, so contributing to our editor Daniel's challenge of getting the newsletter out in a timely manner. It has been just a bit over a week since returning from Spain having led the 2022 iteration of the Warriors on the Way pilgrimage for combat veterans with the goal of reducing their experience of PTSD and Moral Injury symptoms. It was the Feast of St Francis of Assisi yesterday and that has made me think of the first pilgrimage I ever went on. That pilgrimage was to Assisi, Italy – home of St Francis of Assisi. Most people are at least superficially familiar with St Francis of Assisi. That is, most people know him as the world's most famous garden statue, typically depicted with either birds or a wolf nearby.

What very few people know is that St Francis was a combat veteran. He went to war seeking glory in battle and to be awarded a knighthood. He was captured soon after he arrived to the battlefield and spent a year as a POW. Upon his release, Francis returned to Assisi. He was known for drinking too much, partying too much, chasing every skirt he saw, and in general being a terrible "garrison soldier." He began to think that he could fix himself if he could only go back to war. He mounted his war horse and rode off with the intent to join the current war – the Crusades. This is when he sensed God's call on his life. After a roadside


argument with the God he heard calling him, Francis turned his horse and rode to the nearest church. Francis says he audibly heard God to tell him to rebuild His church. The local church was dilapidated so Francis put his back into the work and started literally rebuilding this small neglected parish.

Over time, Francis started gaining followers. Others who wanted to do



something bigger than themselves found Francis to be inspirational. Ultimately the number of Franciscans, as they came to be called, grew to the point of being innumerable. The Franciscan revival rebuilt the church in ways Francis could have never imagined. Through his commitment to a greater mission, without a VA, psychologists, psychiatrists, or meds, God turned Francis' brokenness into greatness. To what greater mission will you commit yourself? There are an innumerable number of needs out there. Which one calls you? What greatness awaits you?




