'Godfather' Alex Flores still taking care of problems

A lejandro Flores is a man of few words. His quiet manner and soft-spoken voice might remind you of Marlon Brando, but that's not why people call him "the Godfather." He acquired that nickname in the early days of Chapter XV, when some friends were being harassed by troublemakers.

Alex promised to "take care of the problem," and it seems that he did. The trouble stopped. Afterward, his SF friends, including the late Chapter President Armando Canales, started calling him "godfather" and the nickname stuck. It still fits today. If party crashers show up at the chapter Christmas party, for example, or if a friendly argument gets too heated, Alex may quietly step in and take care of the problem.

He is a native San Antonian, born here to a family of 13 children. He began military service as an MP in the National Guard, which he joined along with two brothers. After high school, Alex enlisted in the Army, completed the basic medic course at Fort Sam Houston, went to Jump School at Fort Bragg and did a stint in Korea with the 82nd Airborne Division. He also deployed to the Dominican Republic as a medical aidman with the 320th Field Artillery during the civil war there in 1965.

He volunteered for Special Forces because he wanted a

promotion. As a young E6 with only four years of Army service, he was sent before a promotion board. But in competition with 10- and 15-year veterans, he realized his chances were nil. So he slipped away to take the SF qualification test and was accepted. "I caught hell from the chain of command," he says, and he was held three more months in the 82nd "for the convenience of the government" before he could begin SF training.

He got his promotion to E7 in Vietnam – along with two purple hearts. As part of the Pleiku Mike Force sent to reinforce Camp Ben Het, he saw some of the most intense combat of the Vietnam war. "It was raining artillery," Alex recalls.

His Mike Force company conducted Blackjack operations and trained Cambodian troops at Camp Dong Ba Thin.

He has never regretted his decision to join Special Forces because "SF training teaches you to survive in any situation," he says. He has served with the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Special Forces Groups.

Alex was widowed in 2002 when he lost his wife Corinne, the mother of his three children. Alex has been an active and contributing member of Chapter XV since its beginning in the 1970s.
