

drinks; entertainment and dancing *a la Dick's,* door prizes and the exciting auction events.



CSM (Ret.) Eduardo Fernandez, an Associate Member of Chapter XV and owner of The Drop Zone Café & Bar, died Aug. 15 in San Antonio after a long illness. He was buried at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery on Sept. 1.

A Korean War veteran who served 29 years in the Army, Fernandez is survived by his wife of 27 years, Esperanza (Hope) Fernandez, who was also his business partner and constant supporter in his many veterans' service activities. He also leaves two daughters, a son and several grandchildren.

A life member of the Alamo Silver Wings Airborne Association, Fernandez operated the Drop Zone as home base of ASWAA and the airborne community for many years. The club, located just outside Fort Sam Houston at 1802 E. Carson St., honors veterans and welcomes all military active duty and retirees in a "safe haven" environment where they can reminisce and meet old and new friends.



Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant

The Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant is designed to provide a one-time education grant of a minimum of five hundred dollars (\$500.) The number and amount of grants are determined by the Chapter Scholarship Selection Committee with the approval of the Chapter president. Recipients will be announced at the annual Installation of Officers/ Christmas Banquet.

Eligibility:

- 1. Applicant must be a SFA member or legal dependent or grandchild of a Chapter member in good standing.
- 2. A high school student anticipating graduation during the school year of application.
- 3. Grant must be used to attend an accredited college, university or vocational institution.
- 4. Eligible applicants must submit the following:
 - a. A personal letter detailing the applicant's education plans, career aspirations, school they plan to attend, and planned use for the grant.
 - b. Copies of the most recent academic transcripts, SAT scores and other scholastic achievements, and a recent photograph.
 - c. Two letters of reference from a teacher, school counselor or principal.
 - d. A summary of extracurricular activities, non-academic achievements and hobbies.
 - e. A copy of the application to the school or the acceptance letter.

Applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than 15 November. Send to




