# **Remembering Bosnia**



### The Quiet Professionals in Bosnia-Herzegovina

July 2020 marked the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Srebrenica Massacre I U F Φ O O R P

**B** osnia has marked the 25th anniversary of the Srebrenica massacre, the only declared genocide in Europe since the second world war. The execution of

more than 8,000 Bosniak Muslim men and boys took place in July 1995. The massacre is the only episode of Bosnia's 1992-95 war to be defined as genocide. After murdering thousands of Srebrenica's Muslims, Serbs dumped their bodies in numerous mass graves scattered throughout eastern Bosnia, in an attempt to hide the crime. Almost 7,000 of those killed have been found and identified. Body parts are still being found in mass graves and are being put together.

A DoD article dated January 27,1996, relates that Special operations forces from the Army, Navy and Air Force conducted numerous missions supporting NATO's implementation force in Bosnia. Nearly 700 members of the Army's Special Operations Command deployed to Bosnia in mid-December 1995 and began numerous operations throughout the Balkan nation. Included were more than 100 reservists serving in Special Forces, Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations positions.

Army special operations units included the 1st Special Forces Group, 5th Group,10th Group, the Army National Guard 20th Special Forces Group, and portions of Fort Braggs (N.C.) 4th Psychological Operations Battalion, 96th Civil Affairs Battalion, and 112th and 528th Special Operations Signal Battalions. Special operations personnel served as liaisons between NATO forces and local nationals. Other tasks included unconventional warfare, foreign internal defense, special reconnaissance, counterterrorism, and humanitarian action.



**Solis Deployment** in January of 1996: assigned as an advisor to the International Police Task Force (IPTF).

**Mission**: provide for an immediate and lasting ceasefire; separation of military forces, withdrawal from demilitarized zones by all warring parties, establish lasting peace in Bosnia y Hercegovina,

**Principal Task:** Rebuild police forces in Bosnia and Croatia per the General Framework Agreement for Peace, negotiated at Dayton, Ohio. Focus on internationally accepted standards of policing and criminal justice activities of police, the courts, and corrections.

**Result:** Starting the implementation of police reform, IPTF screened 44,000 personnel for certification of police officers and the accreditation of law enforcement agencies. Before the conflict, the police were part of the military. During as well as in the immediate aftermath of war, police forces were separated along ethnic lines, operating within the geographical coverage enjoyed by their ethnic group. Although ethnic/political divisions continued, an integrated police force was established and still exists today.


Is the New Year doomed? NO - Of course not! Instead, it


