Summary of Chapter Business:

1. **Merrill Hall, Treasurer** provided the December 2020 current 2021 Budget Report. Membership voted unanimously to accept the budget reports as written.
2. The February 2021 member meeting minutes were posted in the March newsletter. Membership voted unanimously to accept the budget reports as written.
3. **Membership Secretary Sergio Vanegas** announced that the Chapter membership stood at 230 members.
 - a. Former 7th SFG(A) **Pat O'Neil** announced as new member at the meeting.
 - b. National SFA and Chapter XV are reconciling roster information for the new National SFA database.
4. **Mike Brown** updated the Chapter on the cancellation of the 2021 Cotulla Wild Hog Cookoff. The Chapter will maintain its two spots for next years event.
5. **President John Lopez** the Chapter on three Special Forces related charity events for the months of March and April (both dates passed as of the writing of the meeting notes).
6. **President John Lopez** presented VFW Post 8541 Commander **Bill Smith** with a check for \$1200 to support the Post's charitable activities.
7. An annual scholarship update was provided. The current 2021 Chapter XV scholarship fund is now at \$9600 with a 30APR21 deadline for applications.
8. **Chapter Vice President Pat Meffert** will lead the annual memorial service for former Chapter XV members on 10APR21 at 1000 hrs. at the Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery. He is confirming any COVID related restrictions and will announce if applicable. The April members meeting will be following the ceremony.
9. **Canyon Lake Picnic Coordinator Raul de La Garza** announced that reservations and status of the annual May picnic were still pending a decision and approval to proceed by the Ft Sam Houston MWR due to the COVID pandemic.
10. **President John Lopez** announced that a flag detail is needed for the Memorial Day services to be held Monday May 31st.

Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant

The Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant provides scholarship grants to SFA Chapter XV members, their dependents, children and grandchildren. The number and amount of grants are determined by the budget and the Chapter Scholarship Selection Committee, with approval of the Chapter president. Recipients will be announced at the June Membership Meeting.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a Chapter member in good standing or the dependent spouse, child or grandchild of a member in good standing, or child or grandchild of a deceased member who was in good standing at the time of death. Applicant must have been accepted by, or already attending an accredited college, university or vocational institution.

Application Process:

Applications must be submitted and postmarked not later than 30 April to be considered. Eligible applicants must submit the following:

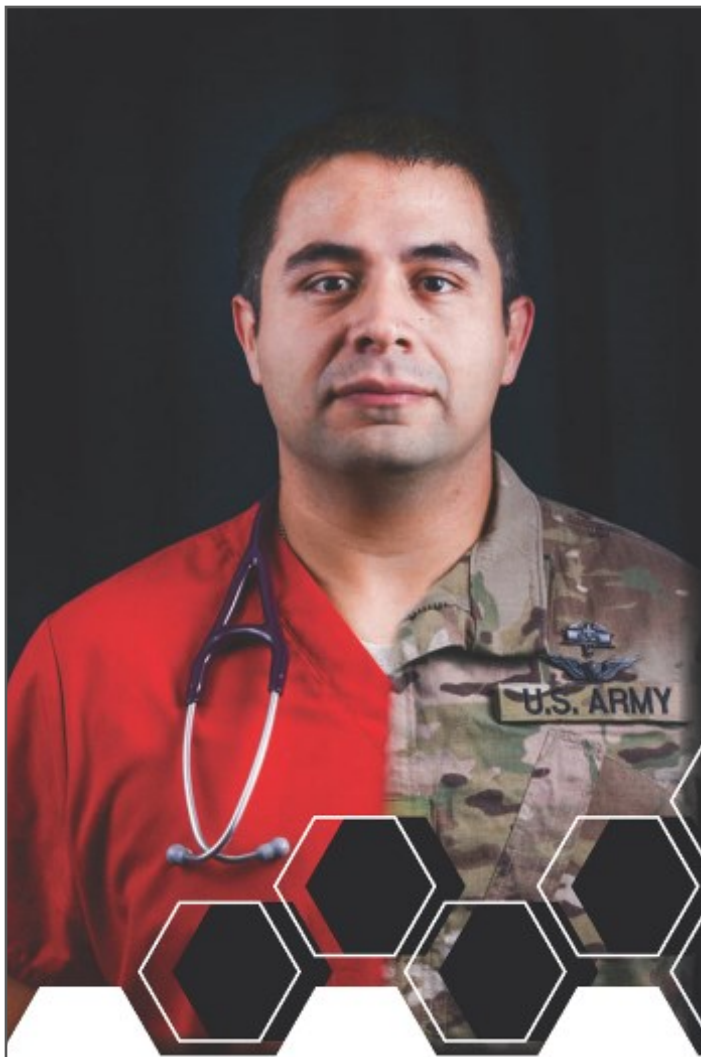
- a. A sponsor letter from Chapter XV member that states full name, member number and relationship to applicant, and the applicant's full contact information.
- b. A personal letter detailing the applicant's education plans, career aspirations, school they plan to attend and planned use of the grant.
- c. Copies of most recent academic transcripts, SAT scores and other scholastic achievements, and a recent photograph.
- d. Reference letter from teacher(s), school counselor or principal. (minimum of one required)
- e. Summary of extra-curricular activities, non-academic achievements and hobbies.
- f. A copy of the application to the school, or acceptance letter from the registrar that the student has already been enrolled.

All items listed above are required. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Submit applications to:

St. George: Liberating the Oppressed

Happy Easter! Easter, the commemoration of the resurrection of Christ from the dead, marks an end of Lenten Fasts and celebrations of new life. Even for the non-religious, Easter is a perfect spring-time holiday – ending winter and marking new growth. Easter is also one of the few holidays with no fixed date and can shift as to when it is celebrated. A different holiday, with a fixed date, celebrated in April is the Feast of St George on the twenty-third of April.

The interesting thing about St George is that he is more well-known for his legend than he is for his real life. In the legend, George, a knight on horseback, comes across a village terrorized and oppressed by a dragon. The villagers, fearing the dragon, regularly feed it virgins to prevent it from destroying the village. In response to learning this, George kills the dragon with his lance, saving the virgin and liberating the villagers from the dragon's oppression. The legend is a simple allegory for fighting evil, protecting innocence, and providing for the common good.

In real life, George was a Roman soldier under the emperor Diocletian (late 200s-early 300s), whom it is believed attained the rank of military tribune (colonel). Emperor Diocletian ordered the most severe persecution of Christians in the history of the Roman Empire. During this era of severe persecution, George refused the unlawful order to engage in the torturous persecution of Christians and resigned his commission. In response to the refusal to obey the unlawful

order, George was arrested, tortured, and executed. His execution makes him one of the incredible number of soldiers who are counted among the martyrs through the history of the Church.

With Easter behind us and the Feast of St George still before us, a few points to consider. What part of yourself do you wish to renew or refresh with Easter new birth? How can you help destroy evil, protect the innocent, and provide for the common good? And, what are you willing to sacrifice rather than betray your moral standards?

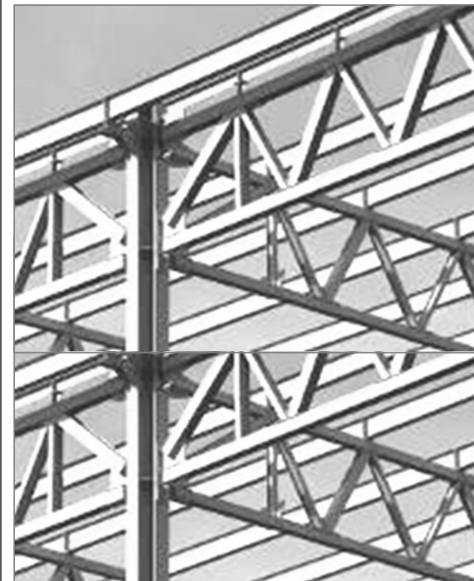

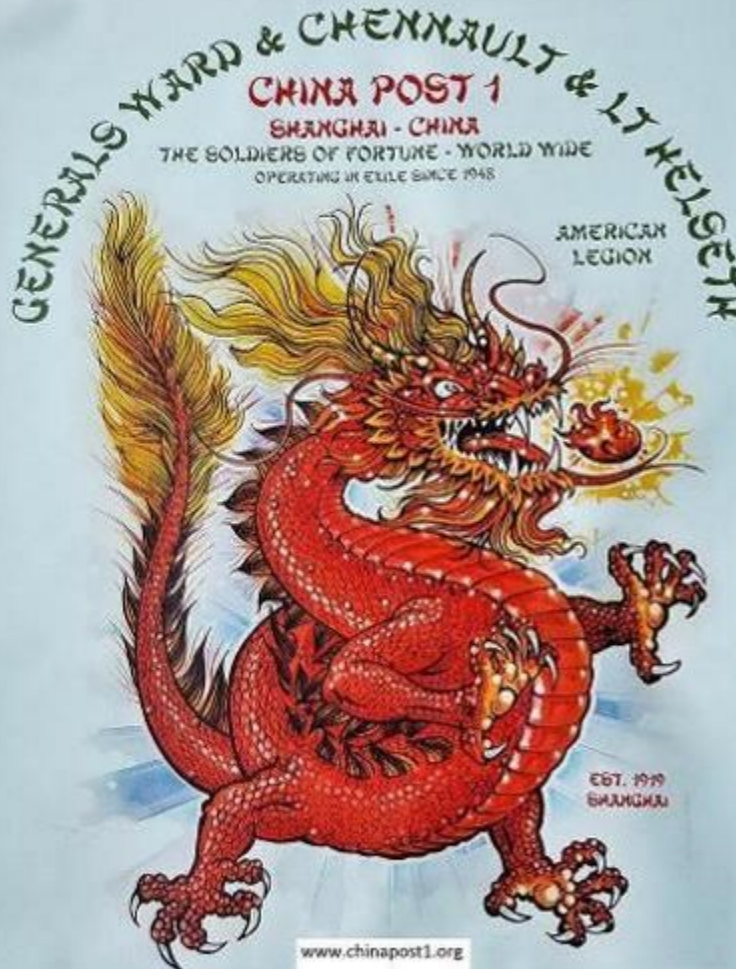
