- **2. Sick and Distressed:** Chapter member Edgar Morales is home recovering from multiple surgeries. He is available for visitation or phone calls.
- 3. Chapter **Treasurer Pete Martinez** provided the monthly and annual Budget update. The budget was accepted as read.
 - **a.** Assistant Treasurer Merle Hall briefed the 2023 proposed budget with changes from previous years. The Chapter will be holding some charitable contributions until later in the year due to declining revenue. The Chapter will reassess the budget situation later in the year and allocate donations as money is available.

- Veteran Affairs advocacy to review current military/personnel service medical records or post-service VA.
- → Pre-transition briefings for Special Forces soldiers and their family.
- Assess previous service documentation or records for a condition or an injury that could have potentially led to a service-connection: the in-service injury or diagnosis.
- Access to our regional Accredited Veterans Services Officers (VSO) to file an original or updated VA disability claim.
- Locating any treatment records or archived documents as evidence to submit when filing VA disability claims.


