

MARCH 9-11—COTULLA WILD HOG COOKOFF

ou know the weather can be a little "yucky" for the LaSalle County Fair at Cotulla. Rain, clouds and/or drizzle often happen. However, that's never made any difference to contestants at the fair's traditional Wild Hog Cookoff, which happens this year on Saturday, March 10.



The hog-cookers are always well prepared. Here's a first-hand report from one of them:

"First, we find a wild hog of the proper size, kill and butcher it appropriately. On Friday afternoon, we transport it to our reserved space at the fairgrounds

and enjoy some liquid refreshment.

"Next, we prepare the grill, the seasonings and the hog, put them all together in the right sequence, and have more liquid refreshments. Finally, we light the fire.

"Waiting for fire to get 'just right,' we tell some stories while having more liquid refreshments. We put the pig on the grill. Sleep. Wake up and check the pig.

"After breakfast (Karen's tacos and Buddy's Bloody Marys,) we get serious about the pig. Baste it, turn it. Adjust the fire and coax the pork to golden, succulent doneness. Prepare irresistible packets of pork for the judges. At noon, we turn in our official pork entries and have some liquid refreshment while we wait."

That's as far as we've ever gotten in the competition, but we always have high hopes. Our team leader, Mike Brown, and our lead chef, Steve Hermann, now have two years experience in the competition and are determined to outdo such lowly competitors as H.E.B. (last year's winner.) They do need our support, so come on out to the fairgrounds and help cheer them on. Bring the kids, bring Grandma, bring lawn chairs. Enjoy the carnival and the livestock shows. Stay Saturday night for the concert and dance.



Born in New York and raised in Italy, Vito "Tutuc" Cellini went from street gangster to soldier to resistance fighter to secret agent – all before he was twenty-one years of age.

Drafted into the fascist Italian army against his will and sent to the front line, he deserted and joined Tito's Yugoslavian Partisans fighting the Nazis, returning to Italy to join the Allies amid one of the biggest cover-ups of the European war.

He ended the war working covertly with the American OSS (forerunner of the CIA) hunting down criminals and undesirables.

Sailing home to New York in 1948 with a forged Italian passport and just 12 cents in his pocket, he was arrested at Ellis Island. Since then, Cellini's inventiveness, reputation and irrepressible sense of adventure have taken him all over the world, often putting his life in great peril.

Respected by the New York Mafia, Cellini later negotiated with some of the most feared organized crime syndicates in Italy. Nicaragua's President Somoza sought his advice on guerilla warfare and weapons tactics, and while in Nicaragua he was embroiled in the assassination of a high profile journalist and had

to flee for his life.

Cellini has kept Federal Agents informed of credible plots to assassinate known enemies of the United States. He even served for a short time, albeit inadvertently, as bodyguard for a notorious drug lord in Mexico.

He has never been afraid of taking the law into his own hands because, he says, sometimes that is the only way to survive.

His inventions, including the *Cellini Muzzle Brake*, have earned him 19 patents and the undying respect and gratitude of members of the U.S. Special Forces and Law Enforcement. He has been privileged to count some of America's most revered and decorated military heroes among his closest friends.

Cellini is, more than anything, a patriot; a man who puts honor above all. And while some of his adventures make fictional spies and secret agents pale by comparison, unlike his fictitious counterparts, Cellini always remained faithful to one woman.

Now at the age of 94, he finally feels comfortable talking about his life, and he isn't pulling any punches.

The good. The bad. The ugly. The truth.

'There Is Healing in the Hump'

friend of mine who is a Marine Corps
Infantryman with combat deployments in Iraq
and Afghanistan once told me, "There is healing in the
hump."

He was, of course, speaking of the time spent logging miles under a rucksack. Time to think, consider, contemplate, plan, and pray all while putting one foot in front of the other. The Ruck March – just about everyone who has served in the military has done it, and benefitted from it, even if only in training.

The Warriors on the Way pilgrimage intends to capture the benefits while leaving the negatives behind. A 180-mile pilgrimage in Spain on the Camino de Santiago during the last two months of September, Warriors on the Way will travel through historic cities of Astorga, Ponferrada (home of one of the largest Knight Templar Castles still standing), Portomarin, and the gorgeous mountains of Galicia.

Each pilgrim will have the opportunity to participate in the ancient ritual of leaving burdens at the foot of the Cruz de Ferro, see the site of a documented miracle at O Cebreiro, and, ultimately, complete their journey at the amazing Catedral de Santiago de Compostela.

Warriors on the Way is a purpose-designed pilgrimage for Combat Veterans by Combat

Veterans. Capitalizing on the latest research in PTSD and Moral Injury care, pilgrim veterans will join in the tradition of pilgrims who have been walking the Camino de Santiago since the 9th Century.

Today the Camino welcomes pilgrims of all backgrounds from around the world with an established route with full logistical support. This means that while each day may be long, the weight each pilgrim must carry will be light (a max load of 18lbs).



VFW Post 8541 Educational Scholarship

The VFW Post 8541 Educational Scholarship is designed to provide financial assistance through two annual scholarships of \$2,000 each. Recipients will be announced on 15 April each year.

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be a current member in good standing of VFW Post 8541, its Auxiliary, or an immediate family member of such VFW/Auxiliary member.
- Qualified applicants must be:
 - A high school senior anticipating graduation during the current school year;
 or
 - Attending or accepted by an accredited college, university, or vocational education institution.
 - C. Applicant must have a 2.5 GPA or better at the time of application.

Procedure: Eligible applicants must submit the following:

- A personal letter detailing the applicant's affiliation with VFW Post 8541, education plans, career aspirations and name of school they plan to attend.
- Contact name of the recipient institution's financial office to receive funds on behalf of the student.
- Copies of applicant's most recent academic transcripts or, if awaiting high school graduation, SAT/ACT scores, along with transcripts.
- Two letters of reference from a professor, instructor, teacher or administrator from current or former educational institution.
- e. A summary of scholastic achievements, non-academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and organizational memberships.

Applications must be received by VFW Post 8541 no later than 31 March 2018. Send to
