We do a buy 2, get 1 free program for any special events, fundraisers and such," he says. "All that is needed is a flyer for verification and tax purposes."



The VBSN track is open to veterans from all branches of the service and is designed to build on the education and experience of the veteran with a system of assessment that will allow for advanced placement in the curriculum based upon demonstration of knowledge and skill. This accelerated 12-month track has online classes in addition to clinical instruction guided by assigned clinical coaches and nursing clinical faculty. The track has clinical sites in Abilene, Amarillo, Austin, Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, Lubbock, Odessa and San Antonio.

# **Army Changes Rules for Retiree Uniforms**



In 2020, the U.S. Army is replacing the blue Army Service Uniform with the new Army Green Service Uniform. A key difference between the uniforms is the shoulder sleeve insignia of the wearer's unit of assignment that is sewn on the left shoulder of the Army

Green Service Uniform, but is not worn on the Army Service Uniform. Before retired soldiers may wear their service uniforms, they must replace their last unit's shoulder sleeve insignia with the new 3-inch diameter retired shoulder sleeve insignia (pictured above).

Retired Soldiers who wear the blue Army Service Uniform Extracted From Army Echoes Magazine, must wear the Retired Identification Badge, a two-inch badge that identifies them as retired. Soldiers who wear

the new Army Green Service Uniform and older service uniforms that include a shoulder sleeve insignia should wear the new retired shoulder sleeve insignia.

Army policy permits retired members to wear uniforms only "while attending military funerals, memorial services, weddings, inaugurals, and other occasions of ceremony [including] attending parades on national or state holidays, or other patriotic parades or ceremonies in which any active or reserve U.S. military unit is taking part. Uniforms for these occasions are restricted to service and dress uniforms."

## **Chapter XV owes big thanks to Charlie Daniels**

Charlie Daniels Oct. 28, 1936-July 6, 2020

July 6 was a sad day for America. That day we lost a patriot who loved America, the U.S. military and its veterans. Charlie Daniels, born in Wilmington, NC, died of a stroke in a Nashville hospital at age 83. He is survived by his wife Hazel and son Charlie Daniels Jr.

"He was a singer, songwriter, bandleader and a blazing fiddle player on hits like 'The Devil Went Down to Georgia," wrote the *New York Times*. A legendary musician, he was a member of the Country Music Hall of Fame, the Grand Old Opry and leader of the hugely popular country-rockers, the Charlie Daniels Band.

**CHAPTER XV OWES** a big thank-you to Charlie Daniels and the staff and family that he left behind. Charlie was so dedicated to the military community that he had a military advisor, Joel Pruitt, 5<sup>th</sup> SF Group (Ret.) and former VP of Chapter 38. Through Joel, Charlie hosted an annual luncheon in Nashville for all attendees at the 5<sup>th</sup> Group Reunion. At the luncheon in September 2019, Charlie took it a step further and donated an autographed fiddle to every SFA Chapter in attendance. Chapter XV received one. Unfortunately, we never got a chance to thank Charlie for his generosity because we planned to do so after the fiddle was auctioned at a fundraiser. Due to COVID-19, the Chapter still has the fiddle.



So, here is a big thank-you in advance to Charlie for the donation, to his manager David Corlew for coordinating and overseeing the events, and to Angie, who is the workhorse in Charlie's office. Also, thank you to Joel Pruitt for making things happen. We thank you and salute you, Mr. Charlie Daniels. May

### Jesse G. Jimenez Nov. 25, 1946 - July 3, 2020

Condolences to Henry Jimenez, who lost his younger brother, Jesús "Jesse" Jimenez, to COVID-19. Jesse entered the VA Hospital two weeks ago and died on July 3.

He was an Army veteran who served with the Americal Division in Vietnam, then had a long career working as a district manager for the *San Antonio Express-News*. He used a wheelchair in his later years due to paralysis from a stroke.

Henry recalls that he was home on leave when Jesse graduated from Lanier High School in 1966. Henry personally took him to the recruiting station, he says, and supervised his enlistment as a diesel mechanic. "My mother wasn't happy with me," he adds.

Jesse is survived by his wife Victoria, five adult children, three brothers and two sisters. Funeral arrangements are pending.

## Friedmans fix up Hill Country camp for Gold Star kids

E cho Hill Ranch Gold Star Camp is dedicated to providing a safe, fun, relaxing and empowering experience to boys and girls from Gold Star Families at no cost to the families. Our goal is to "let kids be kids" and provide the opportunity for them to have friendship and fellowship with others who share their life experiences while having fun in nature.

Located high in the Texas Hill Country on Echo Hill Ranch, Gold Star Camp is 266 acres of beautiful and peaceful land in a private valley. Spring-fed Wallace Creek runs through Echo Hill on its way to the Gulf of Mexico.

**LAST YEAR, MY BROTHER KINKY** Friedman and I decided to re-invent Echo Hill Ranch, which had been a successful private children's camp for over 60 years. Founded by our parents, Tom and Min Friedman, Echo Hill was known by generations of happy girls and boys as a place to have fun, make friends and learn new skills like horseback riding, swimming, nature study, sports and the creative arts. Girls and boys stay with counselors in Western-style cabins. Each bunkhouse has its own bathroom attached with hot and cold water. The camp has a dining hall which can serve over 125 people and a fully stocked



infirmary.

### **BUILDING ON MY YEARS**

of experience overseas as a Foreign Service Officer and an American Red Cross Country Director, I had participated in a recent Joint Special Operations Masters program at the National Defense University at Fort

Bragg. I turned to my military classmates for advice and support, and Echo Hill Ranch Gold Star Camp was born.

**THE CAMP CONDUCTS** 10-day sessions for 50 to 60 boys and girls from Gold Star Families from Texas and around the country. Each child receives individual attention and complete financial support including travel expenses. Volunteers work closely with the entire family to ensure



a positive experience with lasting impact. The program is flexible and also provides opportunities for mentoring and leadership training for teen-agers and young adults.

THERE WILL ALSO BE OPPORTUNITIES FOR "A Day at Echo Hill

Ranch" events, where local children and families can come for a day of programming and special activities.

Over the past months, military volunteers from the San Antonio area have contributed over 700 volunteer hours to support the preparation of Echo Hill Ranch for the Gold Star Children and related programs.




Eventually, we will all enjoy greater freedoms again. Until then, God bless you and let us all work together towards a healthy tomorrow.


