

Flying High with Ch. XV's John and Margaret Tippy

John Tippy has taken off but not landed in more aircraft than most people. He has more than 6,100 freefall jumps from both his military and civilian time in the air.


Tippy's career spanned 22 ½ years from July 1966 to January 1989. He served with the 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) in Vietnam in 1967 and the 82nd Airborne Division in 1968 and 1969 at Fort Bragg. He started the Special Forces Qualification Course in 1969 and graduated in 1970.

Tippy started skydiving in 1971 while assigned to 10th SFGA at Fort Devens, Mass., hoping to get priority to attend HALO (High Altitude Low Opening) school. The Retired MSG became a HALO-qualified jumper in June 1973 while stationed with 46th Company in Thailand.

Tippy also became a skydiving instructor and HALO instructor so he could train others in freefall.

One feat he is particularly proud of — next to being a Team Sergeant with 10th SFGA at Bad Tolz, Germany, and 5th SFGA, Fort Bragg, N.C. — is being selected as a member of the U.S. Army Parachute Team, the renowned Golden Knights, from 1977 to 1978.

Tippy stopped jumping in 2002 while living in Hawaii and bought a sailboat and taught himself how to sail. In 2005, he sailed solo around most of the Hawaiian Islands.





On Dec. 30, 2012, he accomplished this goal making his 6,000th jump at San Marcos, Texas, with the support of his wife of 40 years, Margaret, who has 200-plus jumps of her own.

She was an active-duty, Airborne truck driver and served with 7th SFGA at Fort Bragg, 1976 through 1978. She first met Tippy while driving a deuce and ½ truck for the HALO Committee and he was her skydiving instructor at the Green Beret Sport Parachute Club.

In 2014, Tippy was diagnosed with cancer but he kept on jumping. He spent April to October 2014 going through chemotherapy and radiation. He has been declared cancer free since August 2016. He is currently jumping today with 6,118 jumps and 64-plus hours of freefall time and may consider going for 7,000 jumps.

VA Now Posts Wait Times Online

In a move to provide greater transparency, the Veterans Affairs Department has activated a website to give vets the wait times for appointments at every VA hospital and clinic nationwide by clicking in their zip codes.

The website, <u>accesstocare.va.gov</u>, also provides information on how care at VA hospitals compares with nearby private-sector hospitals and national averages.

The Access and Quality in VA Health site has four sections: "How quickly can my VA facility see me? How satisfied are <u>veterans with their care</u> in my facility? How does care in my facility compare to other hospitals in my area? How is the VA system doing with access nationally?"

The VA called the site the "most transparent and easy to understand wait time and quality data website in the health-care industry."

"Veterans must have access to information that is clear and understandable to make informed decisions about their health care," VA Secretary Dr. David Shulkin said in a statement. "No other health-care system in the country releases this type of information on wait times. This allows veterans to see how VA is performing," he said.



For the next hour or so, we were put through different passing and shooting drills which eventually culminated into a full-court scrimmage. It was a surreal feeling to be down on the court, looking around and realizing I was playing my favorite game on the hardwood I'd spent numerous hours staring at through a TV screen while watching my favorite team and players over the years.

Next, they led us on a tour under the tunnel. Major highlights were a tour of the Spurs locker room and seeing the five Larry O'Brien championship trophies up close. Once we were led back onto the court we had a meet and greet/photo opportunity with Spurs' SG Danny Green. He was the first player I'd ever had a chance to meet face-to-face, so I was appreciative of the time he took on his day off to come meet us.

Another highlight was my wife meeting the Spurs Coyote while hanging out on the bench. She really
