# Treasurer's Report, July 2016

We are about halfway through the 2016 budget year and are on track with planned revenue and expenses. Bankruptcy is not imminent.

A good portion of our July expenses (\$2,600) were offset with donations. The bar bill for Lenny's memorial service was \$800. We received \$750 in donations IMO Lenny from Maria, Chuck Rose, Charles Blake, Marcia Carper and Chapter XV. Our president sent a check for \$900 to a soldier in need at Fort Hood who is the son of a retired Special Forces veteran. The Chapter, Bob Hand and an anonymous Chapter member each donated \$300. We paid \$750 to the Chapter president to help defray his SFA Conference expenses, in accordance with Chapter bylaws. The July noon meal was \$150.

Revenue for the month included a \$100 donation to the Chapter Scholarship Fund by Mike Czarnecki. Raul raised \$120 in door prize tickets and \$14 in merchandise sales. SFA National sent a member-renewal rebate check for \$59. Total uncommitted income for July was \$213.

# **Scholarship Grants**

The Board has approved revised requirements for the Chapter XV Education Grants. Thanks to the Scholarship Committee (Pat Connolly, Dan Hopgood, Henry Jimenez) for working out the new eligibility guidelines. Applications are being accepted from now until 15 November. Below are the revised guidelines.



# **Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant**

The Special Forces Chapter XV Education Grant is designed to provide a one-time education grant of a minimum of five hundred dollars (\$500.) The number and amount of grants are determined by the Chapter Scholarship Selection Committee with the approval of the Chapter president. Recipients will be announced at the annual Installation of Officers/ Christmas Banquet.

### Eligibility:

- 1. Applicant must be a SFA member or legal dependent or grandchild of a Chapter member in good standing.
- 2. A high school student anticipating graduation during the school year of application.
- 3. Grant must be used to attend an accredited college, university or vocational institution.
- 4. Eligible applicants must submit the following:
  - A personal letter detailing the applicant's education plans, career aspirations, school they plan to attend, and planned use for the grant.
  - b. Copies of the most recent academic transcripts, SAT scores and other scholastic achievements, and a recent photograph.
  - c. Two letters of reference from a teacher, school counselor or principal.
  - d. A summary of extracurricular activities, non-academic achievements and hobbies.
  - e. A copy of the application to the school or the acceptance letter.
     Applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than 15 November. Send to


