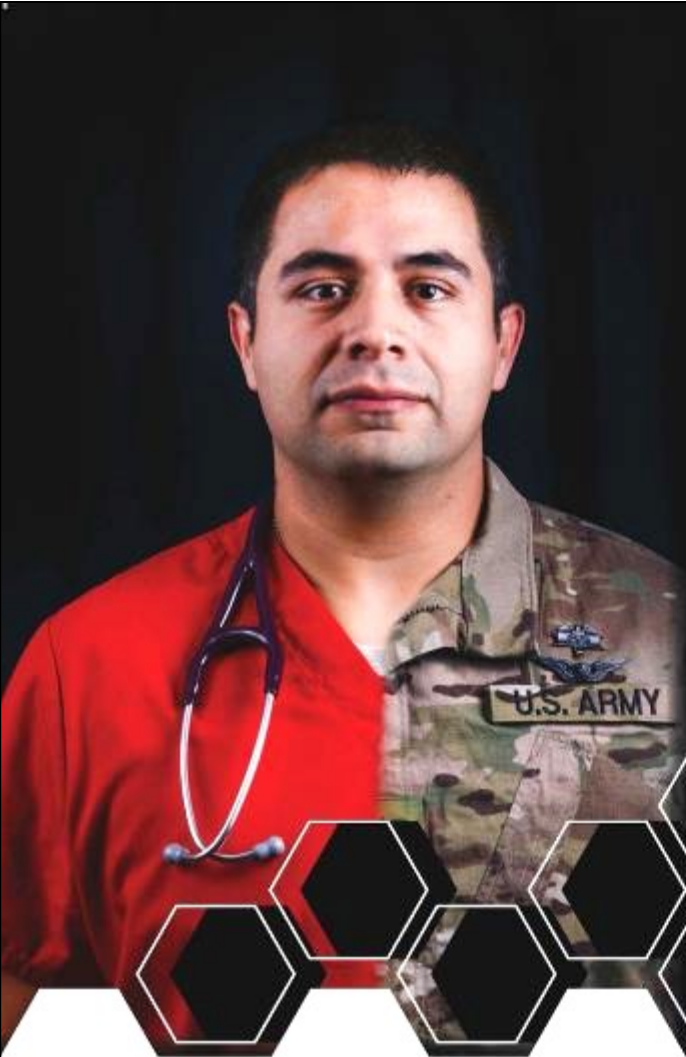

You may have heard rumors that the Chapter was considering purchasing a new trailer to better support our events and activities. Well, it happened! On June 13, the Chapter purchased a new 2018, 7x16 foot Interstate trailer.

Total cost of the trailer (\$5,767.69) was covered solely by new donations, of which \$5,000 was donated by a private citizen who wishes to remain anonymous. The remaining \$767.69 was donated by Bill Smith, Buddy Gee, and Michael Pagel.

We want to advertise our organization as much as possible with this beautiful new trailer, so we will be presenting design ideas at the July meeting. Our ideas are along the lines of getting the appropriate size decals for crests or flashes from all the groups, the SF insignia, the SF tab, the RANGER tab, and something like a CIB/ EIB, Pathfinder, Master Blaster, and/or the Scuba bubble, etc., as well as a sign representing Chapter XV. Any suggestions will be welcome.

We also want to upgrade the interior with appropriate shelving, flooring, wiring, and audio/video equipment

that will add to our comfort and ease of operations during future events.

Any donations toward completing the outfit of the new trailer will be sincerely welcome. We probably need to come up with a name, as well.

Finally, we are not going to “retire” the “War Wagon.” The War Wagon has too great a history with the organization and still serves a purpose. The problem is that it

is unsafe and needs repair. The plan is to upgrade with suspension, put a new coat of paint on it, and a new light kit.



Together, the new trailer and the upgraded War Wagon will improve our ability to represent our organization at events, increase our hauling capability, and hopefully improve the experience our members and guests enjoy at all Chapter XV events.

SFA National Convention 2018

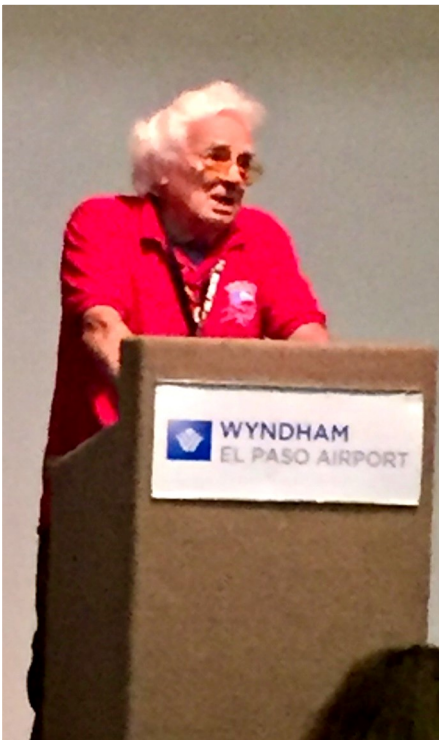
Our members had starring roles at SFA Convention

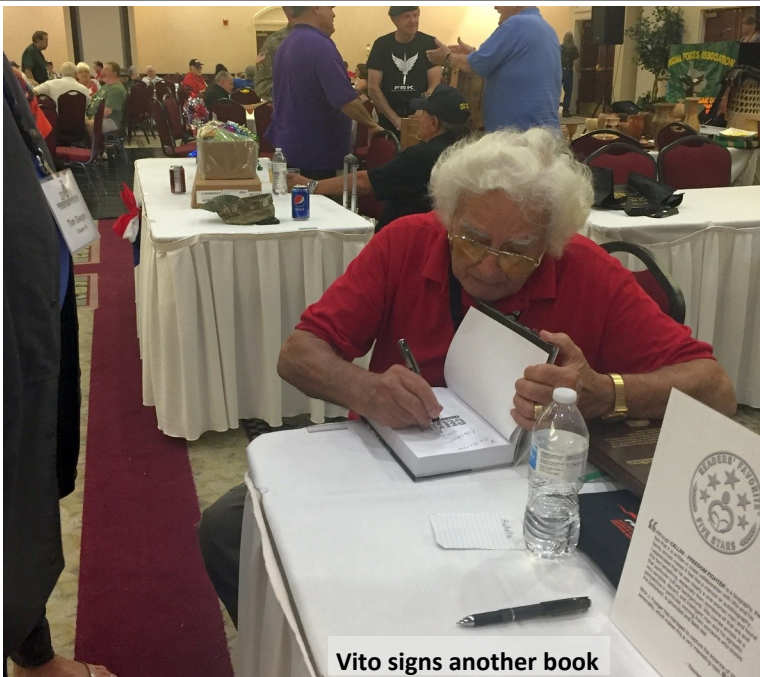

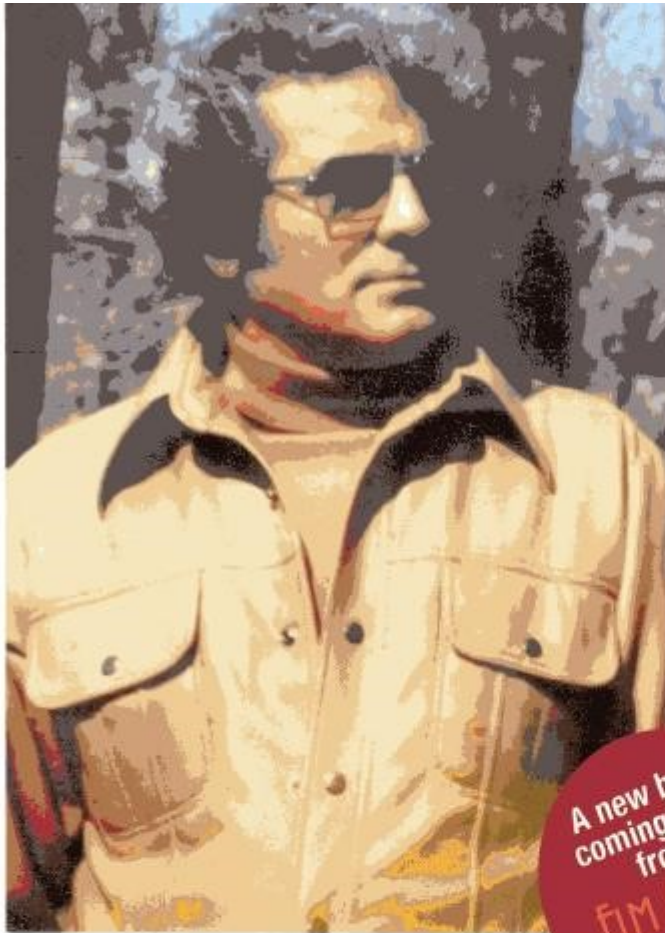
Vito signs another book

Born in New York and raised in Italy, Vito "Tutuc" Cellini went from street gangster to soldier to resistance fighter to secret agent – all before he was twenty-one years of age.

Drafted into the fascist Italian army against his will and sent to the front line, he deserted and joined Tito's Yugoslavian Partisans fighting the Nazis, returning to Italy to join the Allies amid one of the biggest cover-ups of the European war.

He ended the war working covertly with the American OSS (forerunner of the CIA) hunting down criminals and undesirables.

Sailing home to New York in 1948 with a forged Italian passport and just 12 cents in his pocket, he was arrested at Ellis Island. Since then, Cellini's inventiveness, reputation and irrepressible sense of adventure have taken him all over the world, often putting his life in great peril.

Respected by the New York Mafia, Cellini later negotiated with some of the most feared organized crime syndicates in Italy. Nicaragua's President Somoza sought his advice on guerilla warfare and weapons tactics, and while in Nicaragua he was embroiled in the assassination of a high profile journalist and had

to flee for his life.

Cellini has kept Federal Agents informed of credible plots to assassinate known enemies of the United States. He even served for a short time, albeit inadvertently, as bodyguard for a notorious drug lord in Mexico.

He has never been afraid of taking the law into his own hands because, he says, sometimes that is the only way to survive.

His inventions, including the *Cellini Muzzle Brake*, have earned him 19 patents and the undying respect and gratitude of members of the U.S. Special Forces and Law Enforcement. He has been privileged to count some of America's most revered and decorated military heroes among his closest friends.

Cellini is, more than anything, a patriot; a man who puts honor above all. And while some of his adventures make fictional spies and secret agents pale by comparison, unlike his fictitious counterparts, Cellini always remained faithful to one woman.

Now at the age of 94, he finally feels comfortable talking about his life, and he isn't pulling any punches.

The good. The bad. The ugly. The truth.

Nathan Dial has been elected mayor of the town of Estancia, N.M. With a population of about 1,600 people, Estancia is a farming and ranching community located 45 miles east of Albuquerque.

Nate defeated two other candidates, winning 123 votes to 85 for the runner-up and 28 for a third mayoral candidate.

"I would like to thank the voters; I'll do my best to do my best," Dial was quoted in the *Mountain View Telegraph*, which featured a photo of Dial handing out burritos as he campaigned for the mayor's seat.

Estancia, though small, is distinguished as the "Punkin Chunkin' Capitol of New Mexico." It is also known as the site of the last legal hanging in that state. It has police, fire and public works departments, and a city park with a fishing pond reserved for children under 12 and senior citizens.

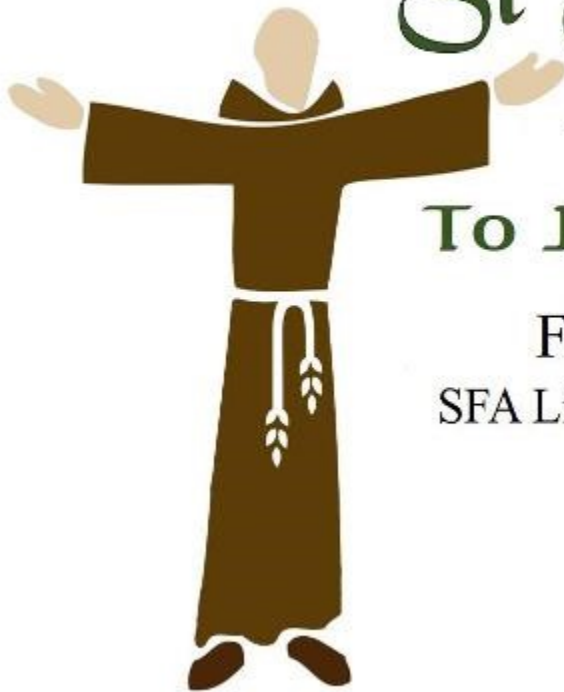
