## Alamo Chapter XV Turning 40



#### Alamo Chapter XV will turn 40 years old on Feb. 6. The 40th anniversary will be celebrated at the monthly membership meeting on Saturday, Feb. 4.

The idea for a Special Forces Association Chapter in San Antonio came about at a meeting on or about Feb. 6, 1975. Twenty-one SFA members unanimously agreed that a chapter should be formed and that it should be named "The Alamo Chapter." The name was selected because the Chapter would be located in "The Alamo City" and it could also honor MSG Gabriel Alamo, Distinguished Service Medal, a Green Beret who was killed in action in Vietnam. The chapter was chartered by SFA National on Feb. 6, 1977, following the customary two-year probationary period.

At least three of the original 21 Chapter members are still active in the SFA. Joe Cavallero said "I am honored to have been a continuous Chapter XV member from Day 1." Joe lives in San Antonio and participates in Chapter activities when possible. Larry Van Horn and Clarence Paige are also charter members who have remained active in the SFA. Larry lives in Oklahoma and is affiliated with Chapter IX in El Paso; Clarence is living in Alvin TX and is with Houston Chapter XXXIX. Below is the complete list of charter members.

#### **MSG Gabriel Alamo, DSC**

S FA Chapter XV was named for the Alamo because the chapter's founders felt the San Antonio shrine symbolized "many of the traits of the Green Berets." The founding group in 1975 also decided to have the name represent MSG Gabriel Alamo, a Green Beret from New Jersey who was killed in action in Vietnam.



Alamo was a veteran of World War II and Korea by the time of the fatal firefight at Nam Dong in 1964. His A-team, commanded by Col. Roger H.C. Donlon, became one of the most decorated in Army history. The battle at Nam Dong resulted in the Medal of Honor for Donlon, the Distinguished Service Cross (awarded posthumously) to Alamo and another team member, plus four Silver Stars and five Bronze Stars with "V" for valor to other members of the team.

Gabriel's son, Michael Alamo Sr., who was 4 years old at the time of his father's death, also earned his green beret and served six years in the Army.



#### Treasurer's Report, January 2017

Last month I failed to recognize Angie Canales for her generous donation and John Rodden for his monthly contribution. This month we tip our berets for donations by John Rodden and Mike Maloy. Our January meeting meal was covered by Mike Pagel, and Lyle Jackson is hosting the Chapter's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary meal for February. Thank you for your contributions! Chapter members have donated or pledged to donate the cost of the meeting meals for the remainder of the year. Thanks to all. Other income for January came from member dues, door prize drawing, merchandise sales and newsletter ad sales, totaling \$2,301.

January was an expensive month. Your treasurer has issued payments totaling \$2,996. At the January meeting the membership voted to approve an additional \$1,000 to last year's scholarship winners. Brandon Hopgood and Natalie Rae James each received an additional \$500 grant. Chapter contributions to charitable causes totaled \$1,200, including our annual donation to VFW Post 8541 and a donation to the Paseo del Rio Association in support of honorary member Ryan Wood. Other expenses included \$200 to reserve space for the Cotulla Hog Cookoff and \$71 to renew the license plates for the war wagon.

The membership voted to approve discounting newsletter ad rates by 25 percent (for members in good standing) on ads purchased by the end of February. These ads will run through the end of the calendar year. See P. 11 for regular ad rates.

The annual membership dues have increased to \$40 for renewals, \$45 for lapsed members and \$50 for new members.

#### **Meeting Adjourned**



#### VA to Eliminate 7 Compensable Disabilities

Not all service-connected medical conditions are incurred or exacerbated in the performance of military duties. In 2015, VA paid 716,000 veterans a total of \$3.7 billion, the Congressional Budget Office estimates, to compensate for seven of the conditions that, according to the Government Accountability Office (GAO), military service is unlikely to cause or aggravate.

Those conditions are **arteriosclerotic heart disease**, **chronic obstructive pulmonary disease**, **Crohn's disease**, **hemorrhoids**, **multiple sclerosis**, **osteoarthritis**, **and uterine fibroids**.

Beginning in January 2018, this option would end veterans' disability compensation for those seven conditions. Under the option, veterans now receiving compensation for those conditions would have their compensation reduced or eliminated, and veterans who applied for compensation for those conditions in the future would not be eligible for it.

An argument in support of this option is that it would make the disability compensation system for veterans more comparable to civilian systems. Few civilian employers offer long-term disability benefits, and among those that do, benefits do not typically compensate individuals for all medical problems that developed during employment.



An argument against this option is that military service is not like a civilian job; instead, it confers unique benefits to society and imposes extraordinary risks on service members. By that logic, the pay and benefits that service members receive should reflect the hardships of military life, including compensating veterans who become disabled in any way during their military service. *Source: U.S. Congressional Budget Office Dec. 16, 2016*


